## Spring Clean-Up Day Scheduled

### RESIDENTS CAN DISPOSE OF BULKY WASTE ITEMS FREE AT THE DENVER REGIONAL LANDFILL

Mark your calendar for the Dacono Annual Spring Clean-up Day scheduled for Saturday, May 30, from 8 a.m. until 1 p.m. at the Denver Regional Landfill in Erie.



This one day event allows residents to dispose of large household items that are not typically allowed through regular trash service. Items accepted generally include yard waste, non-commercial construction debris, old furniture and just plain junk. The event is free to Dacono residents residing within the corporate limits. A valid proof of residency (utility bill) is required.

Stericycle sponsors this event by paying the landfill fee on behalf of Dacono with additional support from Gator Rubbish Removal. "This is a wonderful event for the City of Dacono and we are grateful that during these difficult economic times and cut-backs Stericycle continues to generously support Dacono", said Mayor Wade Carlson.

Members of the Dacono City Council will be volunteering in the clean-up and collecting cash donations to benefit the Tri-Town Food Bank. Hazardous waste items such as paint, tires, com-

puter monitors and car batteries will not be accepted by the landfill. The Weld County Department of Health accepts many of these items every Friday and the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month at the South Hazardous Household Waste Facility, 5500 Hwy 52. Appliances and metal will be accepted at Elliott's Auto Parts. There will be a \$25 charge for appliances with Freon. No tires accepted. Junk vehicle towing will be provided free of charge. Contact Elliott's at 5511 Colorado Blvd. or call 303-833-3501.

### 6 Things to Remember Before You Go

- **Denver Regional Landfill is located at 1441 WCR 6 in Erie, Colorado.**
- **Collection hours are 8 a.m.—1 p.m.**
- **Proof of residency required (utility bill or e-bill notification).**
- **Pick-up or car loads only. All loads must be covered or tied down.**
- **Limit 2 loads per resident.**
- **Non-hazardous debris only.**

## Dacono Library Update

### STRUCTURAL DEFICIENCIES POSTPONE RELOCATION OF LIBRARY

Structural deficiencies at the proposed new library location, 106 5th Street, have postponed the relocation of the library. The overall structural integrity of the building was the

primary reason for the planned renovations to be called-off in March. "The safety of our residents is our number one priority", stated City Administrator Bill Efting. "We are evalu-

ating all options and staff will make a formal recommendation to the City Council in the coming weeks". The library continues to operate at its current location.
