## Halloween Safety Tips

### Safekids Worldwide Offers Helpful Reminders



#### Walk Safely

- ◆ Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
  - ◆ Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
  - ◆ Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
  - ◆ Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
  - ◆ Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- Trick or Treat With an Adult**
- ◆ Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough

to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

#### Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- ◆ Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- ◆ Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- ◆ Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- ◆ Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- ◆ Drive slowly, anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic and turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.



The November 4 election will be a mail-ballot election with ballots being sent the week of October 13. To vote you must be a resident of Colorado for 22 days or more.

## “Rabbit Fever” Alert

Dacono residents who find dead rabbits should contact the Dacono Police Department Community Resource Officer during normal business hours. Environmental health specialists are collecting dead rabbits to test for the disease known as tularemia or “rabbit fever”. Residents should take precautions when handling a dead rabbit.
